London, the 28th March 1908

My dear Misha,

I was extremely glad and deeply touched by your charming letter, the more so as I know that you are not very fond of writing. I do hurry to thank you for it most tenderly. Here, we are living splendidly, like real people "having sightseeing" every day, so interesting and so pleasant. Unfortunately, time passes swiftly and there is only one week left. To-morrow, we are leaving for Sandringham to spend two days there. Aunt Alix must go and see "les désastres de la tempête" and as we did not have good weather up to now, we just postponed the trip. Finally, spring has arrived, it is growing green everywhere and all the flowers are blooming. I hope that you are feeling well and eating enough. I do not understand why you must be on diet again, but if the doctor finds it necessary, perhaps it is better. I am pleased to know that you spend so much time outdoors and that you are having fine weather. Here, we had some splendid days, quite hot and the sun warming up. To-day, the weather is dark and gloomy. Before lunch we had a look at the French-English exhibition site. This is something huge, perfectly built, Indian style in the middle and various pavilions of different styles around. They built them in 6 months, but they are not quite ready and the opening is scheduled for May. They also built an arena for "Olympic Games" like in Athens. This was very interesting and we spent there almost one and a half hour. Yesterday, we visited the British Museum but I believe that you have already seen it and thus will not write about it. It is remarkably interesting and very well designed.

It seems that you are having a very good time in Gatchina, which makes me very happy and that you have had successful hunting. Xenia wrote me that they do not want to leave now and plan to go to Paris later on, when uncle Misha is there. When ? this I don't know. Uncle Bertie decided to come back here to have "a council with the new ministers" and I am afraid that our plans to leave England all together will be ruined and this awfully sad and I can't bear the idea. Everything was so nicely arranged, I and Aunt Alix travelling together to Calais, but now they will not go to Paris as agreed and instead of Saturday they will leave on Monday directly for Denmark and I must leave alone Saturday. This is really a pity and I could scream with fury. I hope to arrive Tuesday morning in Gatchina "mais sans réception" as this will be Holy Week.

Well, good bye my dear Misha. My tenderest kisses to you and Baby. Best wishes also from Aunt Alix and Toria. Regards to all. God bless you !
