Jewish children, refugees from Poland after the Kielce pogrom, arrive at the Prague railroad station en route through Czechoslovakia to UNRRA camps in the U. S.-occupied zones of Germany and Austria. They are part of a larger migration, including adults as well as children, reaching centers at various border points where they receive hot meals, medical attention, counsel and food parcels from the American Joint Distribution Committee.

PRAGUE, CZECHOSLOVAKIA.-- Jewish children fleeing from the threat of violence at the hands of Polish outlaws arrive at the railroad station in the Czech capital en route to U.N.N.R.A. camps in U.S. occupied Germany and Austria. At various border emergency reception centers and elsewhere en route, these children, as well as adult refugees from Poland, received supplementary food, hot meals, medical attention, and immigration counsel from the American Joint Distribution Committee which has gone on an emergency basis in Czechoslovakia to meet the influx of refugees following recent pogroms in Poland.
