"THEY LED US TO VICTORY" is intended to serve as a humble and grateful tribute to the great men who led the Liberator Nations to Victory.







Rt. Hon. WINSTON SPENCER CHURCHILL, C.H., M.P. Prime Minister (until 26th July, 1945).




Field-Marshal Sir BERNARD L. MONTGOMERY, K.C.B., D.S.O. C.-in-C. 21st Army Group.














