Consular visas will be required by British subjects for travel through Jugo-Slavia and in this connection we shall arrange for a collective visa to be issued, the charge for which will be about I/- per person. Foreign nationals must see that in addition to the Jugo-Slavian visa other visas as required are attached to their passports. 
