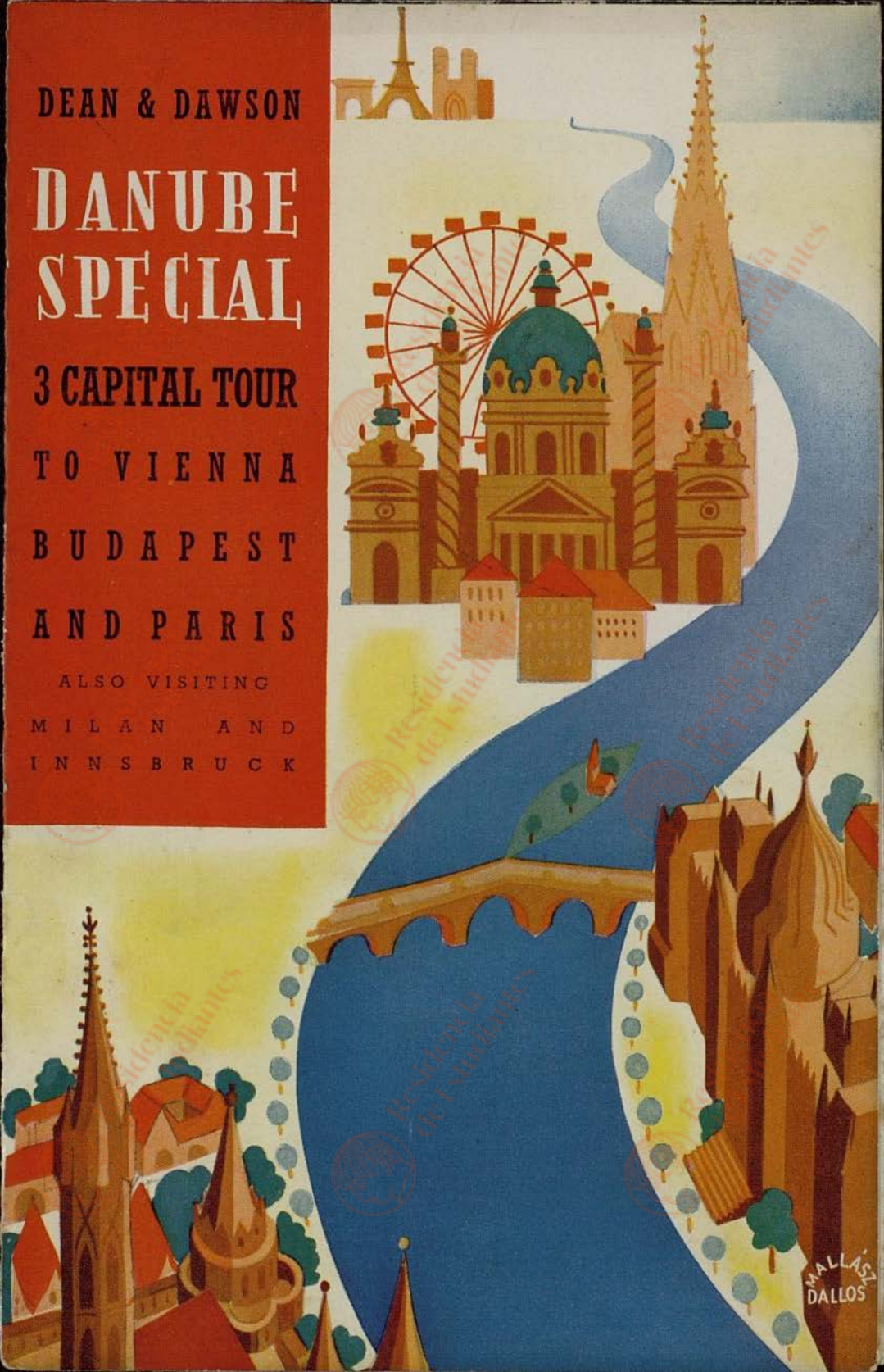

# THE DANUBE SPECIAL + THREE CAPITAL TOUR

## ITINERARY

- 1st Day** Leave London about 8 a.m., travelling via Folkestone/Boulogne en route for VIENNA.
- 2nd Day** The Danube Special will arrive at INNSBRUCK at approximately 7 a.m., and in order to ensure the comfort of the party, arrangements have been made for breakfast to be served and toilet to be effected at hotels nearby the station. After breakfast, passengers will be given an opportunity to see some of the places of interest in Innsbruck before continuing the journey to Vienna. VIENNA will be reached during the late afternoon, an official reception in honour of the Danube Special being given at the station on arrival.
- 3rd Day** A morning tour around Vienna by motor coach will be arranged and will include visits to **Schönbrunn Castle** and the **Town Hall** where an official reception will be given. Remainder of the day at leisure.
- 4th Day** At leisure. During the morning an optional excursion by motor coach to Cobenzl and to Kahlenberg and in the afternoon a further optional excursion by motor coach to Baden and Wiener Wald (the famous Vienna Woods) will take place.
- 5th Day** After breakfast, departure will take place by special steamer for Budapest. This journey will occupy the whole day, which will be spent passing famous old castles, ruined fortresses, the great Hungarian Plain and romantic valleys. At the Hungarian Frontier a choir will welcome the party and will accompany it to Budapest. After dinner on board, Budapest will be reached, both banks of the Danube being illuminated in honour of the party. Official reception on arrival.
- 6th Day** A morning sightseeing tour by motor coach round Budapest, the afternoon being spent at leisure. After dinner an optional tour will be arranged to see Budapest by night.
- 7th Day** Morning at leisure. During the afternoon a second sightseeing tour by motor coach round Budapest will take place.
- 8th Day** At leisure. A whole day optional excursion will be arranged to the "Puszta" (Hungarian Prairie) incorporating a visit to SZEGED, the second largest town in Hungary. Luncheon will be taken at one of the typical old "csárda" with Gipsy band.
- 9th Day** At leisure.

- 10th Day** Depart after breakfast for MILAN, travelling along the shores of Lake Balaton, the largest lake in Europe, and through the mountainous region of Jugo-Slavia.
- 11th Day** Arrival at MILAN will be so arranged that breakfast will be taken at hotels, the remainder of the morning being spent at leisure. After lunch a tour will be arranged by motor coach around Milan, including visits to the famous Cathedral, the Sforza Castle and the Brera Gallery, etc.
- 12th Day** Whole day at leisure in Milan. A half day optional excursion by motor coach to the Certosa in Pavia, which was a Carthusian Monastery founded in 1396, and has now become a national monument. Whole day optional excursion to the beautiful Lake Como. Visits will be made to the famous Villa d'Este, the Villa Carlotta at Cadenabbia, formerly the palatial residence of a nobleman, Bellagio one of the most beautiful spots in the Italian Lake district, and Como.
- 13th Day** After breakfast depart for PARIS, travelling along the shores of Lake Maggiore, the largest of the Italian Lakes, through the Simplon tunnel and along the shores of Lake Geneva, passing Montreux and Lausanne en route, PARIS being reached after dinner.
- 14th Day** Whole day at leisure in Paris. In the morning an optional excursion by motor coach around Paris and in the afternoon further optional excursion to Malmaison and Versailles. After dinner an optional excursion will be organised to see Paris at night.
- 15th Day** Depart at approximately 8 a.m. from Paris, travelling via Boulogne and Folkestone, to arrive at London (Victoria) at about 6 p.m.

VIENNA.—The home of the Waltz, with its magnificent buildings, delightful public gardens and its air of dignity presents a subtle contrast to the gaiety of Budapest. It has with it the lingering fragrance of other days, and one is reminded of the great musicians who have made Vienna their home, and have left behind them a lasting impression of their art.

INNSBRUCK.—Capital of the Tyrol is one of the most beautifully situated townships in Austria, nestling as it does, at the foot of a circle of mountains. The Town itself abounds in places of interest, small wonder therefore that it has built up for itself a reputation as a tourist resort second to none other in the Tyrol.

BUDAPEST.—Scintillating—dazzling—a city of a million lights—the playground of Europe. Budapest has been aptly styled the "Queen of the Danube," and it would be difficult to think of a more fitting title to describe a city so beautifully situated as it is on both banks of the mighty Danube with the picturesque hills of Buda rising prominently in the background.

LAKE COMO.—From Milan an optional excursion will be organised for a visit to resorts on Lake Como, amongst the places to be visited being Villa d'Este, Como, Cadenabbia, and Bellagio, all of which have their own particular appeal and which must be seen to be believed: their exquisite beauty defies description.

MILAN affords an excellent comparison between modern and medieval Italy. The Cathedral, one of the largest in the world, and built of white marble in the Gothic style, is a wonderful example of the architecture of a past age, whilst the Central station represents all that is best in modern engineering and architecture. Milan also is an excellent centre for excursions to the Italian Lake district.

PARIS.—To what can one ascribe the charm of Paris, its boulevards, smart women, cafes, and above all, the air of gaiety, which it exudes all contribute to make Paris one of the most seductive cities of the world.

## THE CHARGE WHICH IS FULLY INCLUSIVE, PROVIDES FOR:—

- (1) Return travel tickets from London back to London. Third Class in England, Second class on Channel steamer and Second or Third class on the Continent, according to fare paid.
- (2) Full accommodation at hotels. (The usual extras at hotels must be paid direct).
- (3) Gratuities to hotel servants and all Government and local taxes.
- (4) Sightseeing excursions where shown including the services of English speaking guides, tips, taxes and entrance fees. Where optional excursions are shown the cost is additional.
- (5) Transfers between stations and hotels and vice versa.
- (6) Reserved seats throughout.
- (7) All meals en route, except afternoon tea, tips included. Extras in restaurant cars must be paid to the attendant.
- (8) Porterage of heavy baggage from London back to Boulogne.
- (9) Services of trained and experienced staff who will accompany the party throughout.

## PASSPORTS

Passports will be required valid for travel in France, Switzerland, Italy, Jugo-Slavia, Austria and Hungary. Consular visas will be required by British subjects for travel through Jugo-Slavia and in this connection we shall arrange for a collective visa to be issued, the charge for which will be about 1/- per person. Foreign nationals must see that in addition to the Jugo-Slavian visa other visas as required are attached to their passports.

## SUPPLEMENTS

The extra charge for a single room is 1 guinea per person, whilst the supplement for a single room with private bath is £2 10s. 0d. per person in addition to the single room charge. For a double room with private bath, the supplement is £2 per person. The additional charge for first class on the cross-channel steamers is 13s. 0d. per person.

## BOOK EARLY

It is anticipated that bookings for these tours will be exceptionally heavy so that early booking is strongly recommended. NO BOOKINGS WILL BE ACCEPTED WITHIN A FORT-NIGHT FROM THE DATE OF DEPARTURE. A deposit of £1 secures a place and forms part cost of the tour.

## EXTENSION IN PARIS

Passengers so desiring may extend their stay in Paris upon payment of a supplement of 10/- per person. This supplement does not include the cost of additional hotel accommodation, neither will a meal be provided between Paris and London nor transfer to the station in Paris. The extra charge will render passengers' tickets available for return independently via Boulogne/Folkestone up to within one month from the date of departure from London.

ALL DEPARTURES ARE SUBJECT TO THE MINIMUM NUMBER OF PASSENGERS BEING BOOKED.

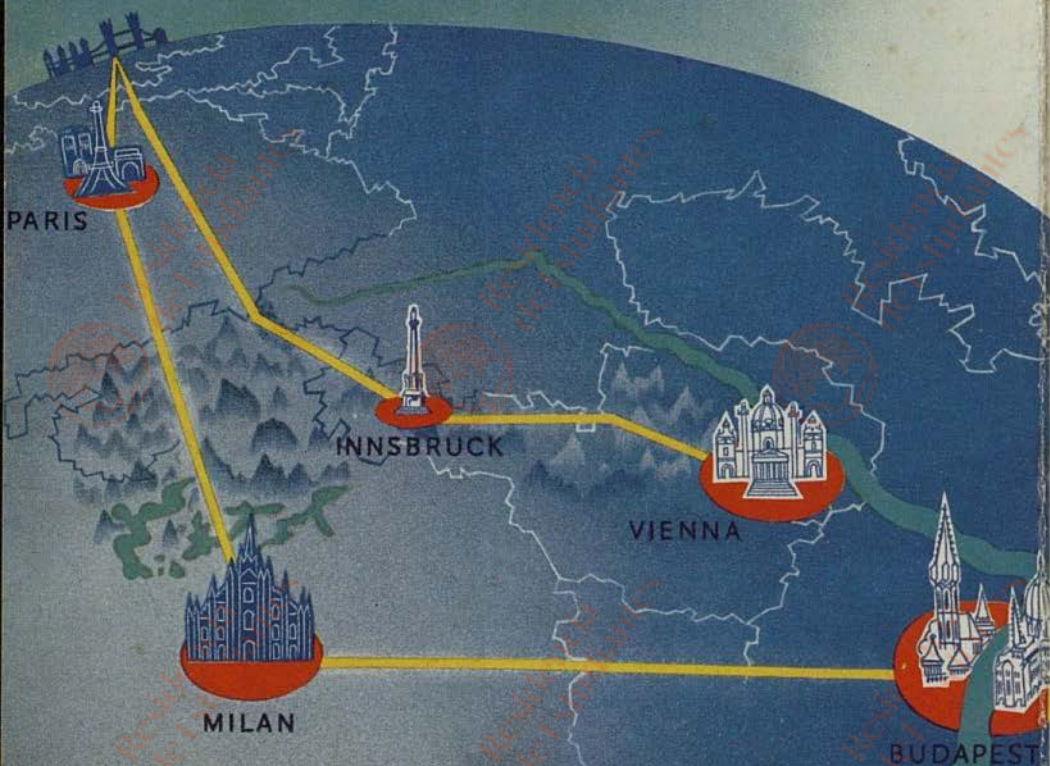
