

FOREWORD

REDUCED FARE TICKETS TO THE CONTINENT

FROM LONDON

This booklet describes a wide range of reduced fares for spending an enjoyable holiday in Holland, Belgium or Germany. Cheapness has been foremost in the minds of the Companies in making the arrangements, and it is hoped that those contemplating a visit to the Continent will find in these pages just the kind of facility they need.

To mention a few instances, one can travel from London to Zeebrugge, for the numerous attractions of the Belgian Coast, for a period ranging from 6 days to one month, for the modest sum of 33/0 return, which provides for third class on the railway and comfortable second class on the steamer and for 40/- a ticket can be obtained with the advantage of inter-availability to and from Flushing, Antwerp or Zeebrugge. Tickets for a similar period are also issued by the Hook of Holland route, inter-available with Flushing at the exceptionally cheap fare of 64/7. Period excursion tickets are obtainable to the Dutch/German Frontier stations via Hook of Holland or Flushing and Belgo/German Frontier station via Antwerp or Zeebrugge which tickets, when used in conjunction with the exceptional reduced fare tickets in Germany, afford very cheap throughout fares to that country.

Those who wish to take just a week-end without the bother and expense of passports can obtain tickets at the same fares to Flushing, Antwerp or Zeebrugge. Week-end tickets to Hook of Holland, and to certain Dutch stations, are also issued in connexion with the Hook of Holland and Flushing routes. Alternatively there are the Week-end Cruises, which will operate every week-end from 25th June to 10th September inclusive, the itineraries covering Germany, France and Holland as well as Belgium.

A cruise "Up the Seine to Rouen," also to Hamburg, Le Havre for Etretat and a "Mystery" cruise have been arranged this year, making the general programme even more attractive than in previous years.

At the same time consideration has been given to those who are unable to afford longer than a day away by the introduction of exceptionally cheap return fares from London to Zeebrugge (26/-), for 17 hours on the Belgian Coast, to Antwerp (35/-) Hook of Holland (48/5), and to other Dutch towns, where a full day may be spent. There will also be inclusive day trips on certain Sundays in April and May for a tour through the Dutch Bulb Fields, and during the season to the Isle of Walcheren via Flushing. No passports are needed for these short trips.

A feature of the Harwich Services is that, whatever ticket a passenger holds, a comfortable berth can be reserved without additional charge.

FROM THE PROVINCES AND SCOTLAND

For people in the Provinces and Scotland there are period tickets from a large number of important L·N·E·R and L M S stations inter-available with Flushing, Antwerp or Zeebrugge; thus passengers have the option of travelling by any one of these routes on either the outward or return journey. Period tickets are also issued to the Hook of Holland, inter-available with Flushing. A further advantage is that the tickets for 6 days to one month are available direct via Harwich or via London (with a few exceptions), and, as the return journey may be made after the fifth day of the validity of the ticket, passengers have the opportunity of spending some time at the East Anglian resorts or in London before returning home.

Those desiring to travel to North Germany can take advantage of the period tickets via Grimsby and Hull to Hamburg, which introduce one not only to that city, but also to Berlin, Leipzig, Dresden, the Harz Mountain district, Lubeck, Bremen and the North German Coast resorts, whilst other tickets are issued via Hull to Rotterdam.

Week-end Tickets without passports are also available via Grimsby—Hamburg, and Hull—Rotterdam. In addition mid-week tickets, with which passports are not required, are issued via Hull—Rotterdam.

CORONATION NAVAL REVIEW AT SPITHEAD

Arrangements have been made for a de-luxe cruise by the L-N-E-R steamships "Vienna" and "Amsterdam" to leave Harwich (Parkeston Quay) on Wednesday 19th May, 1937 to witness the Naval Review at Spithead on Thursday, 20th May. 

HOOK OF HOLLAND, FLUSHING, ANTWERP AND ZEEBRUGGE SERVICES

Tickets which are interavailable with two or more Continental Ports do not cover the journey from one port to another on the Continent.

"D," "L," "P," and "F.D." TRAINS ON THE

Holders of excursion tickets may travel by "D," "L," "P," and "F.D" trains on the Continent provided the usual supplementary charge is paid on the train.

In order that passengers holding tickets through to Switzerland, Italy or Austria, via Harwich—Hook-of-Holland—Bale may travel in the greatest comfort, arrangements have been made whereby they will, on application, be presented (without extra charge) with tickets entitling them to travel by the Rheingold Express. The Rheingold journey must be booked and the Free Ticket issued at the time of booking the travel tickets. This train-de-luxe is one of the finest trains in Europe, and the scenery through which it passes on the Rhine—Black Forest route to Bale is world-famous.

BREAK OF JOURNEY ON THE CONTINENT

Break of journey is allowed in Holland at any station en route provided the appropriate coupon is endorsed by the ticket collector at the barrier immediately on leaving the train. In Germany break of journey may be made without formality at any station en route. In Belgium break of journey may be made without formality at certain stations specified on the coupons.

ACCOMMODATION AT HARWICH (Parkeston Quay)

Passengers travelling to and from the Continent by the Flushing Service can be accommodated for the night on the steamer at Harwich (Parkeston Quay) at a charge of 6/8 for berth and breakfast (with meat or eggs). BAGGAGE

Baggage can be registered from London, Harwich (Parkeston Quay) or any of the stations shown on page 31 to the Dutch, Belgian, or German stations to which the tickets are available. Holders of week-end and period excursion tickets are allowed 66 lb. (Half Ticket 44 lb.) free baggage in registrations to Hook of Holland, Flushing, Antwerp and Zeebrugge, also in through registrations to Dutch Stations. In through registrations to Belgian Stations and Coast Resorts, also to German Stations, the free allowance applies as far as the Continental Port only. The ordinary charges are raised in respect of excess baggage.

With Long Day Tickets only hand baggage is allowed free.

Baggage registered to Belgian Coast Resorts via Zeebrugge and Coastal Tram Service is delivered to domicile without additional charge.

A Week-end, Mid-week, Long Day, Week-end Cruise or Bulbfields Inclusive Tour Ticket contains identity forms which must be filled in, by the purchaser of the ticket, in ink or indelible pencil, when travelling without a passport.

HOLLAND.-With such tickets, provided the identity forms are properly filled in, passports are not required by (a) British subjects, (b) other nationals (except those of Soviet Russia, The Ukraine, Georgia, Azerbaijan and Armenia) resident in the United Kingdom and provided with Identity Books or Registration Certificates.

Otherwise the usual passport and visa regulations apply.

Passports for British subjects are obtainable from the Passport Office, I, Queen Anne's Gate Buildings, Dartmouth Street, Westminster, London, S.W.I.

Subjects of the following countries do not require the Dutch visa when in possession of their national passport: Great Britain, France, Belgium, Luxemburg, Italy, Switzerland, Spain, Sweden, Norway, Denmark, Austria, Germany, Liechtenstein, Iceland, Japan, Cuba, Uruguay, Portugal, Bolivia, Costa Rica, Dominica, Ecuador, Haiti, Honduras, Nicaragua, Panama, Peru, Salvador, Siam, Finland, Mexico, Monaco, United States of America, Czecho-Slovakia and Esthonia.

Passengers other than those mentioned in the preceding paragraph (subjects of Netherlands excepted), who are not proceeding beyond Holland, must have their passports viséd by a Netherlands Consul. In London application should be made to the Netherlands Consul-General, 28, Langham Street, W.I.

BELGIUM.—Travellers to Belgium must have valid passports unless they are nationals of (a) Great Britain, or (b) Belgium, France, Holland, Luxemburg, U.S.A., Italy, Switzerland, Liechtenstein, Iceland, Portugal, Norway, Sweden, Denmark, Finland, Spain, Japan, Uruguay, Cuba, Czecho-Slovakia, Monaco or Ecuador, resident in the United Kingdom and provided with Identity Books or Registration Certificates, holding special Week-end, Long Day or Week-end Cruise Tickets containing identity coupons.

The Belgian visa is no longer required on passports of nationals of the above-mentioned Belgian Passport Office, 10, Belgrave Place, Eaton Square, S.W.I.

The "No Passport" Week-end and Mid-week tickets issued via Grimsby and Hull can be used only by persons of British nationality.

FOREIGN MONEY

HOLLAND.—100 cents equals I florin or guilder. Exchange rates are quoted in guilders to the £. At the time of going to press the rate was approximately 9.00 guilders to the £, i.e., the guilder was worth about 2/3.

BELGIUM .- 100 centimes equals I franc; 5 francs equals I belga. Exchange rates are generally quoted in the Press in belgas to the £, but prices are ordinarily quoted in francs. At the time of going to press, the rate was approximately 145.00 francs to the \mathcal{L} , i.e., the franc was worth about $1\frac{3}{2}$ d.

GERMANY .- 100 pfennigs equals I mark. Exchange rates are quoted in marks to the £. At the time of going to press the rate was approximately 12.20 marks to the £, i.e., the mark was worth about 1/7.
