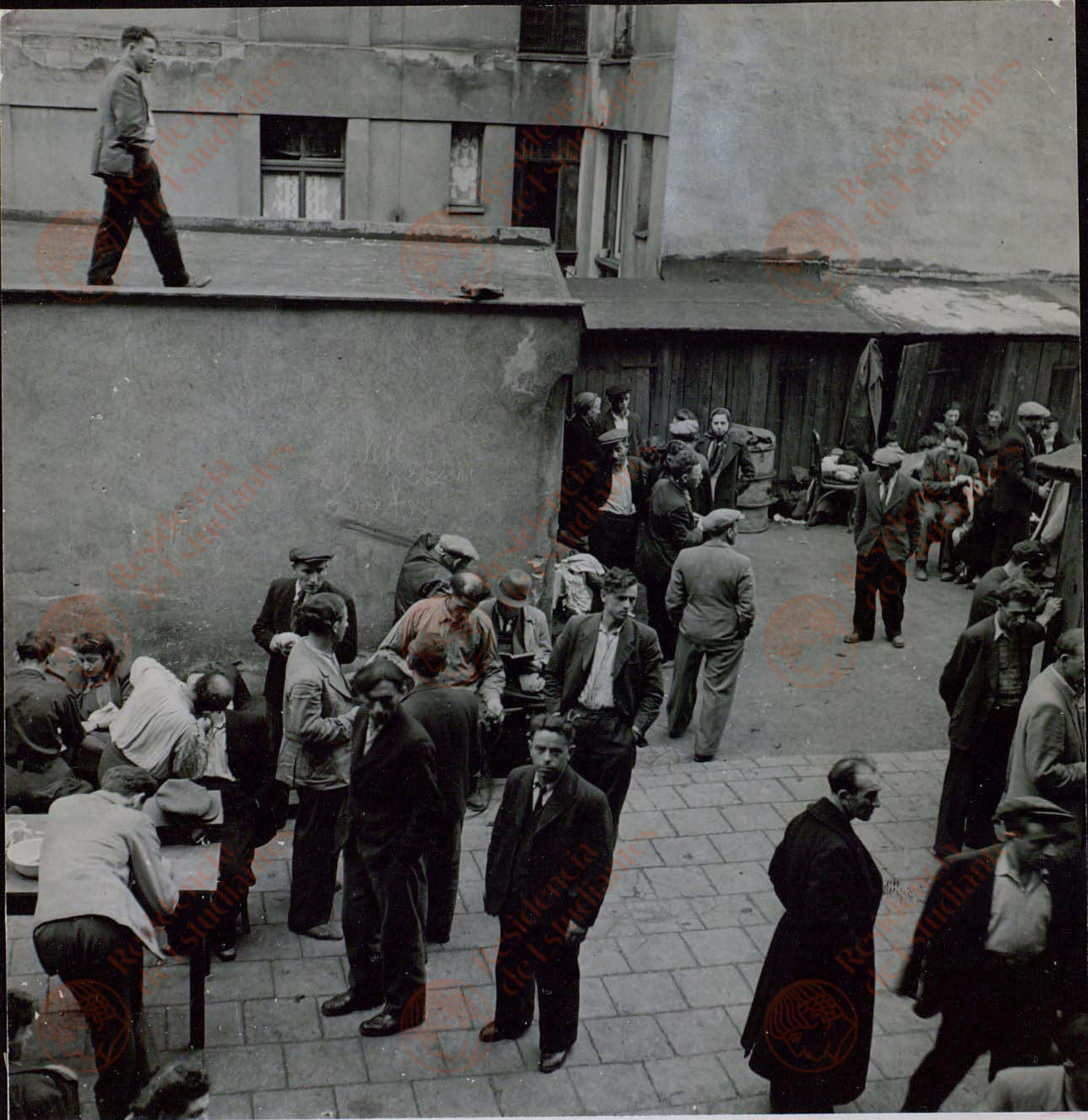




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NACHOD, CZECHOSLOVAKIA.-- Jewish refugees from pogrom-menaced Poland wait in the yard of the emergency reception center at this front town for transportation to U.N.R.R.A. camps in the American Zone of Germany and Austria. At this reception center they receive medical attention, supplementary food and immigration counsel from the American Joint Distribution Committee, which also serves a hot meal at the A.J.D.C. kosher canteen in Bratislava, a way-station on their journey.
