FIELD-MARSHAL GOERING REITERATES COLONIES
DEMAND AT OPENING OF EXHIBITION.
WEARS NEW UNIFORM.

Wearing for the first time his new uniform Field Marshal Goering, who was elevated to the rank in Hitler's Army, Cabinet and Diplomatic re-shuffle, reiterated Germany's demand for colonies when he opened in Berlin an exhibition of paintings of colonial scenes by Professor Feiner.

In his speech he referred to the beauty of the former German colonies.
