Picture shows- The British positions forward of Chaouach were in country so mountainous that even a Bren Carrier cannot reach them, so the ever-improvising infantry fall back on mules and horses. In this picture two mules are taking a load of water in "Jerricans" to the forward troops. (The Jerrican is the new type petrol container).
