**Lammers, HEINRICH**; Chief of the Reich Chancellery and Cabinet Minister, representing the civil service element in Germany's war machine.

**Lebrun, ALBERT**; President, French Republic, since 1932.

**Leeper, REGINALD**; British Minister Plenipotentiary, Bucharest; in charge of News Department, Foreign Office, several years.

**Leopold, KING OF BELGIANS**; "Our neutrality, having been affirmed, must be effective. Belgium has never broken her word."

**Lequerica, SEÑOR**; Spanish Ambassador, Paris.

**Limerick, LADY**; President, British Red Cross Society.

**Linlithgow, MARQUESS OF**; Viceroy of India.

**Lipinski, COLONEL**; Commander, Warsaw City garrison, September, 1939.

**Lippe-Biesterfeld, PRINCE BERNHARD**, husband of Princess Juliana of Holland. Lippe was German principality abolished by Nazi regime.

**Londonferry, LADY**; Founder, Women's Legion (2, Ebury Mews, Buckingham Palace Rd.).

**Loraine, SIR PERCY**; British Ambassador, Rome, previously Turkey, where friend of Kemal Ataturk.

**Lowe, Mrs.**; Chairman, London County Council.

**Ludlow-Hewitt, SIR EDGAR**; Air Chief-Marshal, in charge Bombers.

**Lukasiewicz, J.**; Polish Ambassador, Paris.

**MacDonald, Rt. Hon. MALCOLM**; Colonial Secretary, Britain. Son of J. Ramsay MacDonald.

**Macmillan, LORD**; Minister of Information. Was Assistant-Director of Intelligence, Ministry of Information, 1918.

**McLeay, SENATOR G.**; Member, Australian War Cabinet.

**Madeley, W. B.**; Leader of Labour Party, South Africa, and member of Smuts Cabinet.

**Maisky, IVAN**; Soviet Ambassador in London.

**Malan, J. P.**; Leader, Reformed Nationalist Party, South Africa, which favours severing British connexion.

**Maniu, J.**; Leader, National Peasant Party, Rumania, opposed to King Carol.

**March, DON JUAN**; Spanish capitalist, who placed fortune at disposal of Franco's Nationalist movement.

**Marinescu, GENERAL**; Rumanian Minister of the Interior. Former Chief of Police.

**Matchek, DR.**; Croat leader in Yugoslavia. Pronouncedly anti-Hitler and pro-French.

**Max, ADOLPHE**; Burgomaster of Brussels; was in office in 1914.

**Menzies, R. G.**; Prime Minister Commonwealth of Australia.

**Metaxas, GENERAL**; Military Dictator of Greece since August, 1936.

**Mezhlak, VALERIAN**; Commissar for Heavy Industries, Russia.

**Milne, SIR JAMES**; General Manager, Great Western Railway; member of Railway Executive Committee.

**Molotov, V. M.**; Prime Minister, Soviet Russia.

**Monckton, SIR WALTER**; Controller of Censorship at the Ministry of Information.

**Morgenthau, HENRY**; Secretary of the Treasury, United States.

**Morrison, Rt. Hon. HERBERT**; Leader, London County Council, and Chairman, London Air Raid Precautions Committee.

**Morrison, Rt. Hon. W. S.**; Minister of Food, and Chancellor, Duchy of Lancaster.

**Moscicki, IGNACE**; ex-President of Poland.

**Munters, VILHELMS**; Latvian Foreign Minister.

**Mussolini, BENITO**, The Duce of Italy. Founded National Fascist Party which took part in march to Rome on October 30, 1922. Was party to "Pact of Steel," signed in Berlin on May 22, 1939, which "irrevocably bound the destinies of Imperial Italy and Greater Germany."

**Newall, SIR CYRIL**; Air Chief-Marshal. Chief of the Air Staff since 1937.

**Newton, C. H.**; of London and North Eastern Railway member, Railway Executive Committee.

**Nishio, GENERAL TOSHIZO**; Commander-in-Chief, Japanese forces, China.

**Norman, Rt. Hon. MONTAGU**; Governor, Bank of England.

**Nygaard, JOHAN**; Prime Minister of Norway, since 1935.

**Perry, LORD**; Chairman, Ford Motor Co. Business Adviser, Ministry of Food.

**Perth, LORD (ERIC DRUMMOND)**; Chief Adviser on Foreign Publicity, Ministry of Information. Organized League of Nations, Geneva, and British Ambassador, Rome, before Sir Percy Loraine.

**Pétain, MARSHAL**; French Ambassador, Madrid.

**Phipps, SIR ERIC**; British Ambassador, Paris.

**Piedmont, PRINCE OF**; Commander of group of Italian Army (See also Graziani).

**Pierlot, HUBERT**; Prime Minister, National Union Cabinet, Belgium.

**Pius XII, POPE**; was Papal Nuncio to Germany in 1927.

**Pollitt, HARRY**; Communist Party leader, Great Britain; opponent of Totalitarianism.

**Pound, SIR DUDLEY**; First Sea Lord and Chief of British Naval Staff.

**Raczynski, COUNT**; Polish Ambassador, London.

**Racziewicz, LADISLAS**; President of Poland in succession to M. Moscicki.

**Reading, LORD**; Chairman, Executive Council for German Jewry.

**Reading, STELLA, THE DOWAGER LADY**; Chairman Women's Voluntary Services for Civil Defence.

**Reynaud, PAUL**; Finance Minister, France.

**Reynders, LIEUT.-GENERAL I. H.**; Commander-in-Chief, Dutch Army and Navy.

**Ribbentrop, JOACHIM VON**; German Foreign Minister was travelling in champagne until he married Anna daughter of Henckell, millionaire wine producer.

**Roosevelt, FRANKLIN D.**; President of United States.

**Sa'azai, ANTONIO DE OLIVEIRA**; Prime Minister of Portugal; a financier of genius.

**Salmon, SIR ISIDORE**; Chairman, J. Lyons & Co. Hon. Catering Adviser to Army.

**Sarajoglu, SHUKRI**; Turkish Foreign Minister.

**Sargent, SIR ORME**; Deputy Under-Secretary of State, Foreign Office.

**Savage, Rt. Hon. M. J.**; Prime Minister, Dominion of New Zealand.

**Saydam, DR. REFIK**; Prime Minister, Turkey. Friend of Kemal Ataturk and former Minister of Health.

**Seeds, SIR WILLIAM**; British Ambassador to Moscow since 1938.

**Shaposhnikov**; Russian Army Commander. Chief of General Voroshilov's staff.

**Sidor, COLONEL KARL**; Slovak guerrilla leader.

**Sikorski, LADISLAS**; Prime Minister and Minister of War in newly constituted Polish Government.

**Simon, SIR JOHN**; Chancellor of the Exchequer.

**Sinclair, SIR ARCHIBALD**; Leader of Liberal Party.

**Skladowski, GENERAL**; ex-Prime Minister of Poland.

**Smetona, ANTANAS**; President of Lithuania since 1926.

**Smigly Rydz, MARSHAL**; Polish dictator and successor of Marshal Pilsudski, whom he served as Inspector-General of Forces and War Minister.

**Smuts, GENERAL**; Prime Minister of Union of South Africa since September 6, 1939, when General Hertzog resigned on neutrality issue.

**Somers, LORD**; Deputy Chief Scout.

**Spaak, M.**; Foreign Minister, Belgium, and Socialist Leader in National Union Cabinet.

**Stalin, JOSEPH**; Dictator of Soviet Russia. Aged 57; was General Secretary of Communist Party and succeeded Lenin, substituting "Socialism in a single State" for earlier "world revolution" cry, latter being slogan of Trotskyists.

**Stanley, OLIVER**; President, Board of Trade.

**Starhemberg, PRINCE**; previously leader, Austrian Heimwehr, now forming Austrian Legion, France to fight against Germany.

**Starzynski, STEFAN**; Mayor of Warsaw, the "Burgomaster Max" of Poland.

**Stanning, THORWALD**; Social Democratic Prime Minister of Denmark; son of Copenhagen wheelwright.

**Stewart, SIR FINDLATER**; Director-General, Ministry of Information; previously Permanent Under-Secretary of State, India Office.

**Stoyadinovich, MILAN**; ex-Premier, Yugoslavia.

**Streep, G. A.**; member of Australian War Cabinet.

**Streicher, JULIUS**; publisher of anti-Jewish newspaper, "Der Stürmer," Germany.

**Strumper, GILBERT**; of Southern Railway. Director-General, Transportation and Movements, War Office. Senior railway transport officer in 1914-18 war.

**Tatarescu, G.**; Minister of Foreign Affairs, Rumania, in the All Talents Cabinet, which opposed Iron Guards.

**Taylor, SIR MAURICE**; Senior Military Adviser, War Office, upon production and supply.

**Teleky, COUNT PAUL**; Prime Minister, Hungary, succeeding Dr. Imredy in March, 1939. Is Hungary's Chief Scout.

**Tiso, FATHER**; Prime Minister of Slovakia, assisted German invasion of Slovakia, which preceded attacks upon Poland. Poland seized Javorin from Slovakia in October, 1938, and this led to anti-Polish feeling.



**Count Paul Teleky, Prime Minister of Hungary since March, 1939, is also well known as a geographer.**

**Titulesco, NICHOLAS**; ex-Foreign Minister of Rumania, who fell from power in 1936. Mainly responsible for Little Entente and known as "Foreign Minister of the Little Entente and Balkan Entente," including Rumania, Yugoslavia, Turkey, and Greece. King Carol resented Titulesco's influence and also his pro-French policy.

**Togo, S.**; Japanese Ambassador, Moscow.

**Tweedsmuir, LORD**; Governor-General of Canada.

## U-V

**Ulmans, KARLIS**; President of Latvia and virtual dictator since 1934, when Latvian Parliament was abolished. Was first Latvian Prime Minister when Latvia proclaimed independence in 1918.

**Urbys, JUOZAS**; Lithuanian Foreign Minister.

**Vigon, GENERAL JUAN**; Chief, High General Staff, Spain.

**Vivian, SIR SYLVANUS**; Registrar-General, responsible for National Register scheme.

**Voroshilov, MARSHAL**; Soviet Defence Minister and Commander of Workers' and Peasants' Red Army.

**Vuillemin, GENERAL JOSEPH**; Chief, French Air Force, and hero of numberless air battles in War of 1914-18.

**Wallace, CAPTAIN EGAN**; Minister of Transport.

**Waterlow, SIR SYDNEY**; British Minister to Greece.

**Waterson, S. F.**; Union Commissioner for South Africa, London.

**Wavell, SIR ARCHIBALD**; Lieut.-General Commanding-in-Chief Middle East, including Palestine and Egypt.

**Wedgwood, SIR RALPH**; Chairman, executive committee controlling British railways and London Passenger Transport Board during war.

**Weir, LORD**; Director-General of Explosives Council of Supply.

**Wemyss, MAJOR-GENERAL H. C. B.** Director of Mobilization.

**Weygand, GENERAL**; veteran French soldier of Great War.

**Wilson, MAJOR-GENERAL H. M.**; General Officer Commanding in Egypt.

**Witos, W.**; Leader, Polish Peasant Party; been exiled since 1930.

**Wood, SIR KINGSLEY**; British Air Minister.

**Wood, SIR WILLIAM**; of London, Midland and Scottish Railway; member of Railway Executive Committee.

**Yamamoto, VICE-ADMIRAL**; Commander of Japanese Navy.

**Zetland, LORD**; Secretary of State for India.
