3) In his new West Coast shipyards, attacking a brand new job, Henry J. Kaiser set out to beat the estimated construction time of 105 days per ship. The man who had never even seen a ship launched before 1940 was soon building freighters in sixty days, then thirty, finally ten--a world's record. This photo shows a ship under construction by the new assembly method, in one of the Kaiser yards.
